

# ANZIP AUSTRALIA NEW ZEALAND INFRASTRUCTURE PIPELINE

The Australia & New Zealand Infrastructure Pipeline (ANZIP) provides a forward view of public infrastructure activity across Australia and New Zealand, providing certainty of the forward work programme to investors, constructors, governments and other agencies. ANZIP informs industry of where and what infrastructure opportunities are available, and when they come to market by tracking greenfield and brownfield transactions from when they are proposed, until they reach contractual and financial close.

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## STATUS DEFINITIONS

### Prospective pipeline

Greenfield (construction) or brownfield (government asset divestment) projects needed or likely to occur within the next five years, but is not formally proposed by a state, territory or major local government.

### Credibly Proposed

The project or divestment is supported by a state, territory or major local government, is subject to studies or other processes (such as pre-feasibility or scoping studies or business case development), and is likely to proceed to formal announcement

### Announced

The project has a firm commitment and timeline from a state, territory or major local government, but has not yet entered the market.

### Under procurement

The project or transaction is under procurement (such as a call for Expressions of Interest, requests for tender, or another offer to the market).

### Preferred bidder announced

A preferred bidder has been selected and is in exclusive negotiations.

### Recently closed

Projects that have progressed to contractual close remain on ANZIP for 12 months.

## HUIA WATER TREATMENT PLANT REPLACEMENT

**PROJECT PIPELINE STATUS**

Watercare, the water utility owned by Auckland Council, is currently planning for the replacement of its Huia Water Treatment Plant, the third largest water treatment plant in Auckland. The existing plant treats water from the Upper and Lower Huia Dams and Upper and Lower Nihotupu Dams and is approaching the end of its operational life.

Watercare considered a number of options to upgrade or replace the current plant, and on June 2017, resolved to construct a replacement treatment plant on the Watercare-owned Manuka Road, Waima site, with reservoirs to be located on the Watercare-owned Woodlands Park Road site. The new Huia Water Treatment Plant will have a capacity of 140ML per day, an increase on the existing plant's capacity of 126ML per day.

Watercare announced in November 2018 that it would defer lodgement of the resource consent application for the project until 2019 due to additional studies being undertaken on the proposed sites for the replacement plant. In May 2019 Watercare lodged the resource consent application to Auckland Council for the project.

In May 2019, Watercare lodged their resource consent application to Auckland Council for the project. The resource consent application for the project was publicly released by Auckland Council in August. The closing date for submissions was 2 September 2019.

Tendering for the project will commence in 2020. Construction is expected to start in 2021, with commissioning to occur in 2023.
