

ANZIP AUSTRALIA NEW ZEALAND INFRASTRUCTURE PIPELINE

The Australia & New Zealand Infrastructure Pipeline (ANZIP) provides a forward view of public infrastructure activity across Australia and New Zealand, providing certainty of the forward work programme to investors, constructors, governments and other agencies. ANZIP informs industry of where and what infrastructure opportunities are available, and when they come to market by tracking greenfield and brownfield transactions from when they are proposed, until they reach contractual and financial close.

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STATUS DEFINITIONS

Prospective pipeline

Greenfield (construction) or brownfield (government asset divestment) projects needed or likely to occur within the next five years, but is not formally proposed by a state, territory or major local government.

Credibly Proposed

The project or divestment is supported by a state, territory or major local government, is subject to studies or other processes (such as pre-feasibility or scoping studies or business case development), and is likely to proceed to formal announcement

Announced

The project has a firm commitment and timeline from a state, territory or major local government, but has not yet entered the market.

Under procurement

The project or transaction is under procurement (such as a call for Expressions of Interest, requests for tender, or another offer to the market).

Preferred bidder announced

A preferred bidder has been selected and is in exclusive negotiations.

Recently closed

Projects that have progressed to contractual close remain on ANZIP for 12 months.

BUNDABERG HOSPITAL



STATUS: Credibly proposed

SECTOR: Social infrastructure

JURISDICTION: QLD

PROCUREMENT APPROACH: Unknown

TYPE: Greenfield

In June 2019 the Queensland Government announced \$6.7 million in funding towards developing a business case for a new Bundaberg Hospital. The new hospital will service Bundaberg and the Wide Bay region.

A significant portion of this funding will be put towards design costs once a preferred option has been chosen. The business case will determine where the new hospital will be located and when and how it can be built.

Building Queensland, in partnership with Queensland Health and Wide Bay Hospital and Health Service, is currently undertaking a detailed business case for a new Bundaberg Hospital. This is due to be complete in the second half of 2020.

The business case will consider options for staged construction in order to make some services available prior to completion of the entire project. The business case will also examine the size and scope of the hospital's clinical services, road and public transport infrastructure, car-parking, and opportunities to locate associated health business nearby.

As part of the business case a new site for the hospital will be located given the site of the current hospital is prone to flooding, has space restraints and inefficient layouts. The new site will need to meet or be around 15-20 hectares in size, in an accessible location within 17km of the CBD, have good transport links and strong flood protection.

In August the Queensland Government announced their search for a site for the new hospital. They called for interested landowners to come forward and list their properties for consideration. Once expressions of interest have been received they will be assessed against the selection criteria.

It is expected that a decision about a new site will be made in early 2020.
